



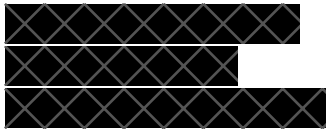

Re: Warning Letter re: Technical Violation of RCW 29A.84.650 (voted twice)

Dear Mr. 

The Jefferson County Canvassing Board through the Auditor's Office reported to the Jefferson County Prosecuting Attorney ("Prosecutor") that you voted twice in the November 2024 general election, meaning you signed and submitted two ballots.

Signing more than one ballot declaration is equivalent to voting twice. Voting twice with the intent to vote more than once is a crime under RCW 29A.84.650(1), chargeable as a Class C felony, which carries a maximum term of five years in prison and/or a penalty of up to \$10,000. In the absence of the intent to vote twice, such as a person voting twice by mistake or out of carelessness, may be issued a civil infraction under RCW 29A.84.650(2).

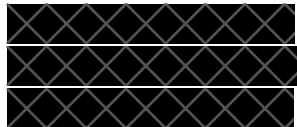
